<b>Comments</b>	<input type="text" value="I strongly object to this application. It must be seen as part of the wider application that is linked with (although not as a full application). Firstly the sheer size of these proposals is obscene. All of this on currently farmed land when we are at a time of needing to self produce. The whole area would be transformed into the concrete built up area ruining the whole area and making the numbers of animals who I regularly see around the area homeless or at risk of being wiped out. Bicester is almost completely surrounded by warehouses already and many of these have signs outside looking for staff. This suggests that there is no shortage of jobs in the area (usually a prerequisite to allow permission for such things), so a town that prides itself on its health conscious premise would begin contributing to huge emissions increase for the workers to travel in from elsewhere (no trains or bus route and the roads around are not suitable for bicycles). Finally, I would suggest that creating warehouses that require trucks to and from them would be intelligently placed in areas that do not already suffer from road congestion on a regular basis."/>
