Comments

The development of these sites will take little into account regards the development of road infrastructure in the surrounding villages and what would be deemed primary thoroughfares. What has been completed already in terms of assessment of vehicles and the impact on theses areas? What has already been seen is the increase in heavy goods vehicles both on the major roads but additionally roads susceptible to damage - this damage can be clearly seen currently throughout this local area as warehousing facilities are constructed and drivers use village "cut-throughs" to access the M40, A34 & A41. Road signs that have indicated roads unsuitable for HGV traffic have been witnessed being ignored by drivers as they provide a "quick" route that would ordinarily mean a longer detour. The development of these sites would increase the number of HGV, and other vehicles in the area with no offer of what is proposed to alleviate instances such as those described above. Bicester has developed numerous large warehousing facilities around its perimeter without development to road infrastructure, as such this impact is being seen around the local countryside as drivers of HGV's use which ever means to continue of their routes. This same mentality will inevitably be seen should these developments process and the investment will only be put into the roads and facilities on-site. In addition to the above, as already mentioned -Bicester is currently surrounding itself with large warehousing facilities - some of which still remain empty! They are placed at a distance from major roads requiring access as described above, but are becoming a blight on local area and landscape. The planning committee need to decide as to whether Bicester and its surrounding area is the remain as a rural area attractive to families and small business, or as is being seen currently an industrial complex with increased traffic, HGV's on roads they are not designed for in local villages, higher levels of pollution- particularly from HGV diesel particulates, road damage and generally an area that will not be seen as a "Garden city" but one of an industrial building site.
