| Comments | <p>Dear Planning Committee, I would like to object to this proposal. I have been a resident of Stoke Lyne for over 20-years and enjoy living in the countryside. I made a choice to live in a village for easy access to the rural walks, peace and quiet. The choice meant not having sacrificing the convenience of nearby shops, doctors, public transport, and basically greater costs than those in a town, but I made the choice so to be in a rural and relatively quiet location. This is all now under threat with a live planning application for the proposal of this warehousing located within a mile of the village my environment. This will ruin our home and community with the increased traffic, noise, light and pollution not to mention the destruction of our beautiful countryside! I work for one of the largest logistics companys so I am very familiar with warehousing and the effects on the surrounding area, despite any rose coloured lens offered by the land agent It will bring with it not only the vehicles of those working there but an endless stream of HGV's and service vehicles, maybe refrigerated vehicles, lifting equipment, shunting vehicles, each supporting and maintaining the site, 24-hours a day 365 days a year with no rest! Each will create a constant noise that will drown out the sounds of the birds, with their engines and warning sounds, not to mention the light and air pollution. For those reading this application who don't have the same knowledge of a warehousing environment I am happy to supply footage of the realities of this. To believe that this will not have a significant effect on our environment as explained are misguided. We have an array of wildlife within the area which most of us in the village are passionate about. This will have a detrimental effect on them, as well as our way and quality of life, damage our beautiful community and devalue our homes for which there is no compensation offered.
