T1 Yew. Crown raise 5.5m over road and crown clean throughout. Reduce roadside crown to balance with remainder.	

T2 Holly. Fell, because it is overhanging the road, and damaging the stone wall.

T3, T4, T5 Elder. Fell, because they are overhanging the road.

Mr Ben Acreman of Acreman's Arboriculture inspected these trees, and has agreed to carry out this work.

The trees are on the bend between East Street and Weeping Cross, which is becoming increasingly difficult to drive around safely. Removing the trees will provide more space for vehicles and pedestrians, and improve the visibility, thereby helping to make the bend safer.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.
