Comments	<input type="text" value="I support this application wholeheartedly. Over and above the physical damage to the verges at the bottom end of the village, and the detrimental effect on its appearance, it has been increasingly difficult to guarantee safe passage through one of the main village exits. In consequence, I now frequently do a c. three mile detour when wishing to approach the village from the A422 in Wroxton. While parking is a major issue in other areas of the village, and my own grass bank has lost about two feet in thirty years because of erosion by passing traffic, houses adjacent to the section in question do not have off street parking of their own. There is no public transport in Horley: abandoning car ownership is not a viable option. As others have pointed out, there are times when it would be impossible for an emergency vehicle to pass: one of the recent occasions being a serious fire in a neighbouring village. This section of road is heavily used by walkers, including children, some of whom, having come from the scout camp, will not be familiar with the road or its dangers. There are blind spots from both approaches. i trust the application will viewed sympathetically."/>
