### Recommendation

Oxfordshire County Council, as the Local Highways Authority, notify the District Planning Authority that they *object* to the granting of planning permission.

## Comments

### **Vision Splays**

In order to demonstrate that the access for this site is safe, diagrams showing a minimum vision splay of 2.4m x 43m in both directions are required. Unless a reduced value could be justified by the data from a speed survey. The applicant must demonstrate that the necessary visibility splay is available. If a speed survey is to be carried out then it must be with an Automatic Traffic Counter over a period of at least one week.

# **Obstructed Vehicle Spaces**

The Oxfordshire Street Design Guide outlines that if constrained along one edge then the width of a vehicle space should increase to 2.7m. With the implementation of the fence, the two 'end' vehicle spaces should increase to 2.7m in width from 2.5m for accessibility.

### INFORMATIVE

Please note If works are required to be carried out within the public highway, the applicant shall not commence such work before formal approval has been granted by Oxfordshire County Council by way of legal agreement between the applicant and Oxfordshire County Council. This is separate from any planning permission that may be granted.

If you would like to discuss this application further, please do not hesitate to contact me. I understand the desire of the local residents to create this car park to reduce on-street parking stress. If this application is re-submitted acting on the points above, I would offer no objection to the granting of this application.
