| Comments | Woodstock town centre is congested and has insufficient parking at present. The only car park has lost 13 parking spaces to electricity charging posts. The doctor's surgery is too small for the current number of patients and the 3/4 planned housing estates will further overburden it. There are no firm plans for a new Woodstock surgery. We have no library, which was demolished and nothing yet in it's place. The centre of Woodstock has no provision for such large scale developementwe have no supporting facilities. How will the already oversubscribed schools cope with so many more pupils? The plans talk of expanding the secondary school, but this is currently restricted as surrounded by housing on 3 sides. Staff already have to park on the playing fieldwill this be the next green space that we will lose? School drop off and collection times plus coaches and buses alredy cause huge traffic problems in surrounding residential streets. This development, together with the Banbury Road site will have a massive and detrimental impact and is in danger of turning Woodstock into a suburban sprawl. In addition we have also had the suggestion that 1000s of acres of Blenheim land should be covered in solar panels, will the potential buyers and Cherwell council be happy for this on the doorstep?
