Description of works - Walnut tree (T1) in the front garden of 2 White Horses Close, identified with the tag number 0908

On 10th July 2007 we were granted consent to reduce the crown of the walnut tree (TPO 3/2005) by 20% (UPRN 019911905352)

We are requesting crown reduction of 30% (and removal of any dead branches at the same time), or removal, if that is considered appropriate. If we are replacing, we would like a deciduous tree that provides autumn colour, such as a liquidambar styraciflua worplesdon.

The tree has grown in the last fifteen years and now blocks a great deal of light to the garden and front of the house. It restricts the natural warming that takes place from sunlight, and the house is very cool: with energy costs a concern, even this amount of warming would be a help.

The tree drops all its walnuts before they reach maturity, and these create brown marks on the lawn if they are left.

During high winds we regularly see a large number of small branches, and one or two larger ones fall. The tree overhangs our neighbour's garden, and his drive: we are concerned about damage to his car.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.

- mark the position of the tree(s) to which you want to carry out work and identify them by the number shown in the Tree Preservation Order where possible; if you use a different number, please make sure that this can be matched with your description of the tree(s)
- if there are many trees on the site, make clear which tree(s) are included in this application by:
 - o marking all trees on the plan, but only numbering those to which you want to carry out work
 - showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
 - o adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)
