

Additional comments:	This PCN area is already under pressure from nearby planning applications, and this application directly impacts on the ability of the Deddington Practice, Bicester Health Centre and Montgomery House surgeries in particular, to provide primary care services to the increasing population. Primary Care infrastructure funding is therefore requested to support local plans to surgery alterations or capital projects to support patient services. The funding will be invested into other capital projects which directly benefit this PCN location and the practices within it if a specific project in the area is not forthcoming.
