Felling of two Lime tree - the one adjacent to the drain manhole (No. 1 on the attached Tree Site Plan) and the one next to this (No. 2 on the attached Tree Site Plan), as the root system on both these trees is undermining the main sewage drains and is very likely to be causing damage to the footings of the Bungalow due to the size of the roots found and the closeness to the footings. Would be happy to plant a new tree near the site of Tree No. 2 that would have a much smaller root system so to ensure no likely root damage to the property in the future

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.
