Chesterton village is becoming less like a village with every planning application that gets accepted. Over the past years cars and congestion in our village has increased significantly. The new developments already mean roads which were once reasonably quiet are now busy all day long. There are no facilities for shopping or a post office in Chesterton. Everything you have to do on a daily basis means getting in the car and driving out of the village. All the new homes already imposed on us have doubled the traffic around the village. Are we to have no areas of green left? Fields which once provided a place to walk and enjoy the countryside are now housing estates. What of conservation? Our home is in a conservation area. If we wish to even reduce the height of a tree we must apply for planning permission, yet building more houses does not seem to be a problem. Those fields suggested for this development are one of the only remaining green spaces left around this village. It seems there is little concern for village life, conservation or the environmental impact of even more development. Chesterton village does not need more houses. There would be even more cars parked along the Alchester Road making it impossible to get through the village when children are being dropped off and picked at school. Cars and congestion which now stretches to almost the end of the Alchester Road. We have experienced people losing their temper & sounding horns at one another as the road is too narrow for two cars to pass whenever others are parked along the side. Leaving our driveway at these times can also be challenging so already we try to avoid these periods. The School which has absolutely no adequate parking for safety of these children coming & going. Twice a day every day of term it is mayhem along this stretch of the main road through Chesterton. More houses, more cars, more children at the school, therefore more chaos & congestion. Chesterton should be kept a village with what little character we have left as a village intact.
