Comments	<input type="text" value="With thanks to the Banbury Guardian for alerting its readers to this new, but essentially unchanged, application to blight Banbury with a huge warehouse development I reiterate my objections to the previous application (22/01488/OUT).

I wish to object in the strongest possible terms to the above application. The scale of this development would destroy the rural nature of the area which includes ancient ridge and furrow pasture and established trees which are of much greater environmental benefit than any new planting could generate for many years. The minimal retention of existing trees and hedgerows and new planting would in no way compensate for such a huge development of more of the unsightly warehousing which already blights Banbury, many of which stand empty. The A361, despite its unsuitability, is already subject to extremely heavy HGV traffic, made worse by the HS2 development. The amount of additional traffic and air pollution that would be a result of this development goes against every environmental target we are constantly being told is required to safeguard future generations. Once our countryside is lost it will be gone forever."/>
