I have attached an email from the applicant for reference, it states that the applicant has right of land over the area used to park vehicles and the resulting proposal ultimately would not change this situation. The figures for vehicle parking are maximum standards and therefore the increase in vehicle parking is not mandatory, but when assessing Street View it is clear that there is enough space for 2 vehicles in the blue line area. An additional vehicle is not likely to create significant parking stress or safety concerns.

Overall, this proposal is unlikely to have a detrimental impact on the highway in terms of safety or convenience. Therefore, OCC *do not object* to the granting of planning permission.
