Hi Tom

The larger areas of scrub plan • ng (southern and eastern areas) and wild • ower meadow should have 'pioneer' Betula pendula and Alnus glu • nosa trees to provide be • er visual mi • ga • on and wildlife habitat (refer to amended drawing enclosed) – tree loca • ons to be indicated on a detailed landscape proposals. However the narrow verge (road access) where maintenance vehicle access drivers will compromised by overhanging vegeta • on, unless the narrow verge can be widened with o • site plan • ng outside the applica • on boundary: Prunus spinosa requires space because once it establishes it will sucker and spread.

More detail on the landscape proposals required:

- 1. A planting schedule is required to indicate the Latin names of native trees and shrubs, their sizes, root condition and numbers.
- 2. Exis•ng trees on or adjacent to site are to be retained shall be protected in accordance with BS 5837:2012 Trees in rela•on to design, demoli•on and construc•on. Recommenda•ons from commencement to comple•on of all works on site.
- 3. All excavated areas to be back•lled with subsoil to <u>BS 8601:2013 Speci•ca•on for subsoil and requirements for use</u> (imported subsoil to be laid on site's exis•ng subsoil pro•les) and overlaid with topsoil to <u>BS 3882:2015 Speci•ca•on for topsoil BS 3882 General purpose grade.</u> All topsoiled areas to be clear of rocks and rubble larger than 50mm diameter and any other debris that may interfere with the establishment of plants. Shrub areas to have a minimum depth of 400 mm topsoil. Tree pit soil depth/volume in accordance with <u>BS 8545:2014 Trees: from nursery to independence in the landscape. Recommenda•ons.</u>
- **4.** The Emorsgate Mixture EM 1Mix to be implemented in accordance with Emorsgate's instructions.
- 5. All plants are to be supplied in accordance with Hor •cultural Trade Associa •on's Na •onal Plant Speci •ca •on and from a HTA cer •ed nursery. Delivery and back •lling of all plant material to be in accordance with BS4428/JCLI/CPSE Code of Prac •ce for 'Handling and Establishing Landscape Plants, Parts I, II and III.
- 6. All trees to be supplied planted in accordance with BS 8545:2014
- 7. Na•ve shrubs are to be planted in their species groups of 7,9 and 15 in a irregular pa•ern.
- 8. All plants shall be watered to •eld capacity immediately a er plan ng and mulched with 50mm depth of medium grade crushed mulch.
- 9. All trees to be double-staked with cross bar and •ed, using 1.5 m long, 75 mm diameter rounded tree stakes 75mm brace, rubber •e and spacer block. Stakes not to extend more than 650mm above ground level.
- **10.** Root barriers (ReRoot 1000 or equivalent) to be included adjacent to structures, cabling and services, where necessary.
- 11. Unless otherwise stated plan ng shall be carried out during the period of 1 November to 31 March when the ground is not frozen, or waterlogged.
