Reasons included: 1. The development breaches the settlement boundary (very clearly defined by the ancient Woodstock Way) and therefore constitutes an anomalous accretion to the settlement of Kirtlington. This development patently cannot ever classed as 'infill'. 2. Ironically, since the earlier applications, Kirtlington, classed as a Category A village, has lost several of it's amenities: the village shop, a post office which is moribund, a pub, and the bus service has been, and still, is, under threat. This means little or no public transport and residents have to drive even to their GP surgeries in Islip and Woodstock. 3. The access point is a real concern, opening as it does onto the increasingly busy A4095 on sharp bend where the 50mph meets the new village 20mph signage, and visibility is severely restricted. 4. The A4095 traffic through Kirtlington, always heavy, is subject to huge increases

for local pedestrians, horseriders and motorists alike.
