Thank you for consul•ng us on this reserved ma•ers applica•on. An archaeological mi•ga•on area was agreed with the applicant, shown in the WSI submi•ed with discharge applica•on ref: 24/00121/DISC. In discussions prior to this mi•ga•on area being agreed, the archaeological consultant working on behalf of Bloor Homes (Orion Heritage) assured that the 'archaeological no-build areas' would be fenced for the dura•on of the development. This was to protect the archaeological remains in western parts of the development, which had been iden••ed during the evalua•on trenching of the site. The WSI subsequently submi•ed by the applicant re•ects this agreement and states:

'These areas will be fenced o• prior to and throughout the construc•on works to ensure that there are no impacts. As part of the proposed development, the areas shown in brown on Figures 2 and 3 will be excluded from any form of development; they will be sown with grass and paths will be mown; there will be no so• landscaping and there will be no plan•ng.' (Wri•en Scheme of Inves•ga•on for Archaeological Excava•on at Banbury Rise, Banbury. Worcestershire Archaeology 2023 p.2),

The plans submi•ed with this Reserved Ma•ers applica•on show na•ve woodland and scrub mix plan•ng, as well as individual trees within the agreed no build area. The plans also show paths addi•onal to those which will be mown running through the no-build area in the northwestern part of the development. This is unacceptable under the agreed WSI, and we will require that these areas of plan•ng are removed from the scheme.

The submi • ed WSI does go on to state:

'An updated masterplan showing the areas of public open space which now exclude wooded plan•ng will be submi•ed to Cherwell District Council as part of the reserved ma•ers applica•on. It is noted that the reserved ma•ers applica•on has not been submi•ed at the •me of preparing this WSI. If the reserved ma•ers are not approved or if they di•er from the plans submi•ed with this WSI, it is noted that further archaeological mi•ga•on will be required and this WSI will be updated accordingly.' (ibid.)

If it is desired that the plan•ng and paths are kept within the landscaping scheme, then a further phase of archaeological mi•ga•on will be required in these areas. The reserved ma•ers cannot be approved at this stage.
