Comments	<input type="text" value="I am dismayed that this application has raised its ugly head again. I wish to reiterate my objections to the previous similar applications in the strongest possible terms. The huge scale of this development can not do other than destroy the rural nature of the area which includes ancient ridge and furrow pasture and established trees which are of much greater environmental benefit than any new planting could generate for many years. The minimal retention of existing trees and hedgerows and new planting would in no way compensate for such a huge development of more of the unsightly warehousing which already blights Banbury. The three eyesores which have been built on the opposite side of the A361 remain empty. The A361, despite its unsuitability, is already subject to extremely heavy HGV traffic, made worse over the last many months by the HS2 development. The amount of additional traffic, air and light pollution (I note that the working hours are listed as 24 hours a day every day including bank holidays) that would be a result of this development goes against every environmental target we are constantly being told is required to safeguard future generations. Once our countryside is lost it will be gone forever."/>
