Comments	<input type="text" value="As largely rehearsed last time this application came forward, I object to this application for the following reasons;

1. The area has valuable landscape features, including some apparently untrammelled ridge and furrow fields.

2. The application also impacts upon the necessarily rural (and therefore discrete) location of the meetings between Ursula Buerton and Klaus Fuchs, whereby the west's atomic bomb secrets were passed to the Russians - arguably one of the most significant events of the 20th century. Surely we should not lose that significant vista?

3. Rather paling beside that is the further consideration that losing this rural landscape will also mean that Oxfordshire loses some of it's last rural areas to the east of Banbury.

4. Huscote Farm has been managed as an almost entirely organic farm since at least the 1940s, which makes it very unusual, desirable (particularly nowadays) and valuable."/>
