Landscape Character Areas

The Approach

During match days, the approach comes alive. The existing retained vegetation and proposed boulevard planting, combined with planting beds have been carefully designed to guide and filter fans as they make their way towards the stadium.

Clear pathways and signage ensure smooth movement, minimising congestion and providing an enjoyable experience for spectators.

The improved cycle lanes and pedestrian infrastructure encourage people to utilise alternative modes of transportation, promoting a greener and more sustainable approach to accessing the stadium and the wider landscape.

The approach to the stadium is enhanced with moments (defined as Instagram moments on the diagram opposite) that are designed to excite and inspire the journey to the stadium.

These moments are explained below:

- 1. The journey begins at the station with way-finding graphics and signage. As well as the creation of a new stepped access from the station.
- 2. The Manor Arch A modern interpretation reinstating the historic Manor arch.
- 3. Once past the manor arch tribute the arrival space in the south eastern corner features, lighting, rain-gardens, seating and space for food vendors.
- 4. Boulevard tree planting, these trees are crown raised to enable visitors to pass under them as a green gateway feature.
- 5. The plaza and the Oxford Utd Ox.
- 6. The players entrance.





JOURNEY TO THE STADIUM DIAGRAM




The Approach along the Oxford Road frontage is designed to enhance the overall experience for fans attending matches while maintaining a 'Green Connection' and pleasant appearance on non-match days. The road has been transformed into a vibrant and pedestrian-friendly space with dedicated cycle lanes and improved pedestrian/cycle infrastructure in line with Oxfordshire County Councils proposals, enabling better connectivity to the scheme and wider landscape.

Boulevard planting and retained tree and hedgerow create a linear green edge, with rain gardens and planting beds strategically incorporated. These elements serve multiple purposes; the rain gardens are designed to capture and store rainwater, promoting sustainable water management practices.

There is an accessible ramp cut into the slope between Oxford Road and the stadium that provides safe access for wheelchair users.


As you approach the new stadium, the first thing you'll notice is the arrival space that's directly adjacent to the road crossing. This area has been designed with pedestrians in mind, providing a safe and convenient space for fans arriving from the nearby park and ride train station.

Along the edges of the arrival space, as it gently falls down toward the stadium arrival apron, you will find a range of amenities set amongst new tree and shrub planting that will make your visit as enjoyable as possible. There are comfortable benches where you can sit and wait for friends, as well as bike racks and litter bins to keep the area tidy.





The Plaza to the north of the new football stadium provides a welcoming open space for supporters to gather and socialise before and after matches.


The space is adaptable and can be configured to suit the needs of different vendors and activities.

The layout ensures easy navigation for visitors, with wide pathways connecting to various sections.


The Plaza is designed to be a versatile and dynamic space that can cater to a wide range of community activities and gatherings.
