Comments	neighbour The planned stadium, which more that 70% of Kidlington residents voted against under the same rules and regulations as a local council election have been casually dismissed out of hand by the County Council. The southern end of Kidlington is a main arterial route out of the village and towards Oxford and to connect to the arterial ring road around the city, match day traffic will greatly impact on this not to mention loss of trade to Sainsbury's and other traders at that end of the village. There is great cause for concern by residents in both Garden City and Gosford Hill, the most likely places to bear the brunt of Oxford United's supporters parking in side roads, and which could eventually lead to residents in those boroughs required to pay for parking permits to be used by visitors to park in the road when visiting. I rather suspect that Thames Valley police will have something to say regarding road closures or diversions, it's also worthy of note that Kidlington fire station and the Thames Valley police HQ need free and clear access on all roads in and out of the village, including that one. Why is everyone bending over backwards to help Oxford united, who are selling the stadium as a local asset, when in fact it's a business for profit like any other. Plus, there is a lease extension on the table for Oxford United to sign that allows them to stay at the Kassam, the claims by the c
