Comments	I currently live just over the Oxfordshire border in South Warwickshire having been born, schooled and now work in an OX postcode. My employer is based in Kidlington. I am a supporter of the football club for some 30 years and have seen the false dawns, poor decision making and green shoots of recovery during that time. This planning application though represents so much more than just a new home for the football club. It provides a national landmark for the local area and wider county. Aside from the short term generation of jobs, there is also the chance for meaningful legacy; the nature and scale of events that could be held at the stadium site greatly surpass what has been possible up until now in the County. It will also drive commerce into Kidlington and North Oxford and will enhance life rather than detract for the local residents, particularly those who will be seeking housing in the area in the coming years. For the football club itself it will provide not only a home of which to be proud and for which the supporter base can actually care for, but could provide the springboard for greater success; this has been demonstrated by 97% of new build stadiums in the last 10 years who have seen attendances rise and income generation increase providing a more competitive first team. In Oxford's case it is not just the men's first team who would benefit but the increasingly popular and successful women's teams of all ages too. The club officials have demonstrated a real desire to not simply build for builds sake, but to invest in the local area in a meaningful and sustainable way and are willing to go above 'the standard' in order to surpass expectations.
