Comments	<input type="text" value="This application means that a site of great biodiversity will be lost. In addition, the gap between Kidlington and Oxford will no longer exist, but it will give permission for urban sprawl to run rampant if passed. We feel that this planning application is going to be a disaster for Kidlington and the surrounding area if passed. There is altogether a lack of adequate parking and little understanding of human behaviour. A large proportion of people visiting the stadium will of course come by car and park in Kidlington and surrounding areas. There will be increased air pollution and unacceptable noise and light pollution too. Whilst I appreciate their efforts to be carbon neutral, there is a perfectly good stadium which will be left unused. This means that whichever way you look at this, it is not going to result in carbon neutrality. The application has shown inadequate planning for the large amount of traffic and pedestrians expected. This will result in people from Kidlington being cut off from emergency services such as ambulance and emergency doctors. Diverting traffic will mean an extra 10 minutes before help might arrive. My disabled son's epilepsy means that his life might be put at risk with these delays. There will also be many other people in Kidlington whose lives will be put at risk. I am begging you please do not pass this application, there are so many valid reasons to reject it. I have listed just a few."/>
