Comments	Strongly object. 2073 out of the 3006 residents that voted, voted against the plans for the stadium. These residents physically turned up and voted to express their feelings and it doesn't appear that they are being taken into consideration when it will impact their daily lives the most. Oxford United have used email campaigns to get supporters to express their support for their application, many providing support without justification to sway statistics. The idea that 90% of fans will travel to the stadium using public transport is insane. The government have introduced the 2 bus fare cap as incentive to get people to use public transport and assist with the costs so the idea that Oxford United can get figures as high as 90% when the lack of use of public transport is a much wider issue is delusional. Instead fans will travel by car and park in the surrounding residential area.
