	the land known as "the triangle". This is a unique opportunity to allow significant investment into the county. The Kassam Stadium is an eyesore and an embarrassment to both OUFC and the City. The proposed new stadium offers the opportunity for a replacement community facility which the whole county can be proud of. A significant benefit is the vastly improved transport links. I have been attending games every year since the Kassam Stadium opened in 2001 and have never been to a match without driving. As a resident of Thame it would be a pleasure to have the opportunity to travel by train from Haddenham & Thame Parkway followed by a short walk to the ground.
