Comments	<input type="text" value="I am writing this comment in objection of the planning application to build a stadium on the triangle green belt land. I am troubled by the prospect of noise pollution relating to the stadium. As a sufferer of tinnitus, the impact of semi-regular and intense background noise is detrimental to my health and wellbeing as it triggers my tinnitus which makes it difficult for me to concentrate on everyday tasks and can even impact my sleep. I work very long hours (60+ a week) and therefore sleep and time for me to wind down is essential. For that reason, I find the building of a busy stadium, not far from where I have lived for over 20 years, very concerning and therefore feel the need to object. On a similar level, I feel that the noise pollution posed by a stadium may impact the lifestyle of PTSD sufferers, especially veterans and domestic abuse survivors. Having a reduced tolerance of loud sounds is often synonymous with PTSD and the noise created by a stadium would definitely pose a risk of triggering PTSD related flashbacks to these groups of people. I feel the current plans do not reflect these concerns. Finally, I feel that traffic concerns (road closures and crowds in the roads) and parking issues such as paying for permits to park outside your own home are also an issue that have not been properly addressed in the current plan, leading me to object."/>
