Comments	<input type="text" value="My family and I STRONGLY OBJECT to Oxfordshire Country Council's proposal to allow Oxford United Football Club to build a stadium and associated commercial development on Statfield Brake and/or the Triangle.

Kidlington is a community with many young families that commute in/out of Oxford for work, school and other activities. Having the stadium will seriously increase traffic congestion, overwhelm parking spaces and risk unsafe parking. Traffic is already congested in the area and it is unreasonable to build a football stadium here!

Stratfield brake is a green belt. Constructing a stadium on green land and the heavy traffic and footfall associated with a stadium will surely negatively affect the green belt and wildlife there.

The Statefield brake green belt is furthermore known to have good biodiversity including numerous bird species which will be adversely affected by the stadium plans.

Flooding - the green belt is an important holding area for rainwater during periods of heavy rain. Taking that away and replacing with a football stadium will dramatically increase surface runoff and affect floodwater management and increase risk of flooding for residents in Kidlington.

The stadium will increase air, noise and light pollution, affecting local residents who DID NOT VOTE FOR THIS STADIUM, and also adversely affect local wildlife!"/>
