The proposed road closures will take away sident's liberty and freedom of movement, restricting when they can leave their homes to avel to the South of the County. The road closures could also cause a potential issue in the nergency vehicles could be held up if there are thousands of fans on the highway exiting e proposed stadium. The A4165 and A4260 are already extremely busy roads, and alread titleneck at the Kidlington roundabout by Sainsbury's. To even consider stopping the traffi II cause traffic tailbacks through Kidlington and South along the A4165 and A4260. The uation is only set to get worse once the building of new houses nearby are completed. The rastructure is simply not in place to accommodate this much change. Proposed parking restrictions: Parking restrictions are proposed to extend from the oposed stadium for some considerable distance into Kidlington and the surrounding areas prevent fans parking in the village and to encourage them to travel by public transport. spaces for shoppers. Due to the proposed road closures (see point 1 above) people wishing to use the Oxford Parkway/Park & Ride car park may not be able to gain access to park their vehicles and could abandon trying to park, resulting in a restriction of use for usual Saturday shoppers, then in turn, fewer shoppers travelling into Oxford on match days. This simply cannot be allowed to happen as people who have used Oxford Parkway/Park & Ride car park will no longer be able to do so, with the potential that Oxford has fewer visitors as the public/shoppers can't access the public transport that they have been encouraged to due to the proposed road closures (see point 1 above) and football fans using a large proportion of the parking spaces at Oxford Parkway/Park & Ride car park.

4. The existing wildlife habitat on the 'Triangle': Planning permission for the construction of a new football stadium should not be granted as it will be incredibly devastating to the biodiversity/wildlife that currently exists on the 'Triangle' and to see the destruction/disappearance of this natural and established wildlife haven is extremely distressing. Proposals have been put forward by OUFC to encourage reintroduction of wildlife to address the biodiversity balance as part of the construction of the proposed stadium, but a large construction as proposed will have an irreversible effect on much of the wildlife that currently exists on the 'Triangle' site, taking years for some of it to be reinstated, with some being lost forever. The fact that the proposed stadium is being billed as green construction is laughable. How can it possibly be seen as 'green' to build a brand new stadium when there is a perfectly usable existing football stadium at Kassam which is has good access from the North and South of the City of Oxford and which doesn't cause a bottle neck of fans, potentially 'trapping' residents in their own village for periods of time on match days.

5. Disruption to residents access to Kidlington village amenities: I am objecting to the proposed construction of a stadium as there appears to be little consideration of residents enjoyment of their own village on match days, in particular, where will home and away fans go before a football match. Usually football fans visit local public houses for a drink prior to a match. The majority of public houses are in the centre of Kidlington. This could see thousands of football fans drinking in those public houses in the centre of Kidlington for some period of time prior to the start of the match. What consideration has been made for residents of Kidlington to shop in their village on a match day without having to negotiate thousands of football fans, and no provision made to keep home and away fans separate to avoid brawling on the streets of Kidlington by rival supporters.

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
