Even if it is true at OUFC cannot stay at their current site, it does not mean they have no option but to uild on the green belt between Oxford and Kidlington. ongestion in Kidlington is often considerable and the stadium will add to the problem. The roposed stadium would lead to even longer queues of traffic, higher levels of emissions and oorer air quality in the area. The proposed closure of Banbury Road for periods on match ays will make travelling from Kidlington to Oxford and vice versa even more difficult - for ne, it will simply not be worth it and I will go to more accessible towns such as Witney istead. This is a shame - in the past I have enjoyed going in to Oxford to shop (both by bus then buying smaller items and by car when shopping for larger items or going to part of the ty less accessible by bus). I feel that retail businesses in the centre of Oxford are bound to e affected, especially around Christmas time. The additional congestion caused both on natch days and other days (resulting from the other commercial facilities proposed) will ave a negative impact on the residents of Kidlington, and on those who regularly travel etween Oxford and Kidlington in one direction or the other. I feel strongly that the road hould not be closed for any time during match days and OUFC should apply for planning to uild a bridge to ensure the safety of fans if the stadium goes ahead. <i>While</i> some fans might use public transport to get to the stadium, it is likely that many fans orm Oxford and the county will arrive by car, some sharing with friends, etc. Away fans are lso highly likely to come by car (public transport is expensive and far less convenient). here are only 106 parking spaces proposed on the site, so the park and Rides will quickly ecome full, making them unusable by people wanting to use them for the purpose of "Park nd Ride
