Comments	<input type="text" value="I grew up 3 miles from The Hawthorns football stadium. On Saturday afternoons and whenever there was a home match we could not leave our estate due to traffic jams. Cars parked on all the side roads making it impossible for local residents. The plan for the stadium on the triangle will cause similar major disruption for local residents, with road closures and large crowds with inadequate local infrastructure. My husband does on call shifts as a consultant in acute medicine at the John Radcliffe and there is a very real danger that he will not be able to reach the hospital in time in an emergency. All consultations so far have failed to take sufficient note of local residents voices who will be most impacted by this development.

Travel disruptions aside, the environmental impact of this new stadium cannot be justified. Not only is this green belt land with precious wildlife, but a perfectly serviceable stadium already exists at the Kassam and all options have not been explored to allow its continued use. In this era of substantial climate change this major and unnecessary environmental impact cannot be justified. The very special circumstances required to build on green belt land have not been demonstrated. Alternative options must be explored."/>
