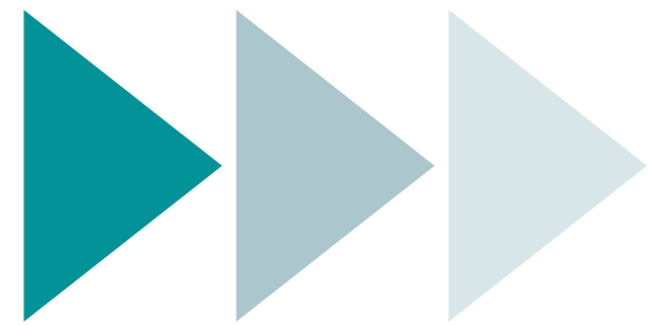




SWIFTLY



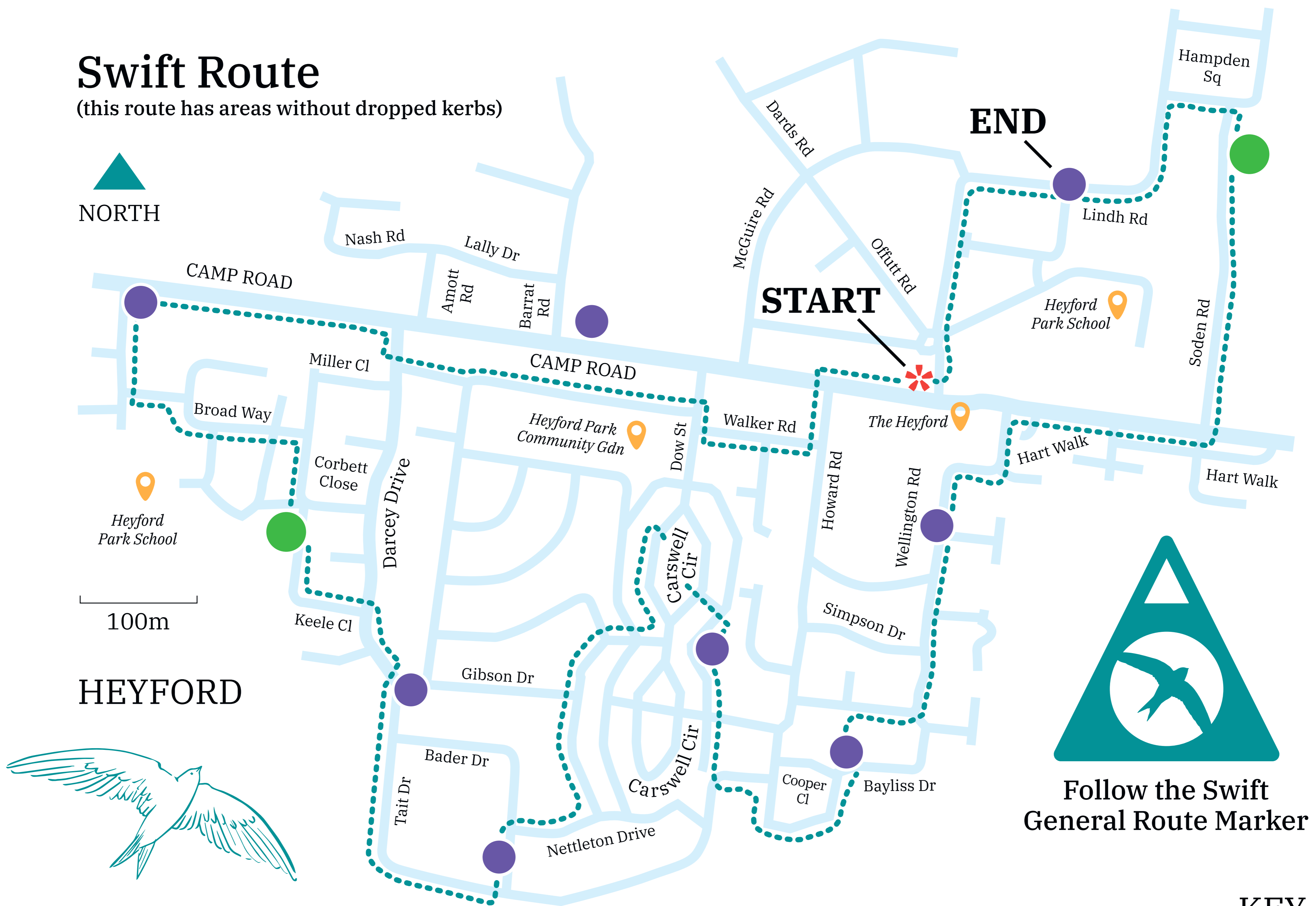
Swiftly was a public art project by artist Kerry Lemon funded by Dorchester Living and Cherwell District Council to create a series of artworks across Heyford Park and a new Healthy Living walking trail.

There are ten artworks dotted across Heyford Park; eight disks and two pillars with colourful rubbing panels created in metal. Each intricate artwork was hand drawn by the artist and celebrates the dual theme of HERITAGE and NATURAL HISTORY. They are also suitable for rubbings so you can take home a copy of the artist's drawing (all you'll need is a crayon and some paper!).
