Comments	<p>I object to this development on ground of social sustainability and community cohesion. Obviously, population growth has some beneficial effects. These may outweigh the negative ones. However, a crucial factor in whether the net result is positive or negative is the rate of change. Apart from the extra burdens on infrastructure and services (which of course can be mitigated to some extent), a sudden large influx of people into an existing community disrupts and damages community cohesion, reduces trust, and can import other problems.</p> <p>Kidlington is already scheduled to grow dramatically by 4,400 new homes. This is arguably already too rapid a rate of change that will inevitably cause community cohesion problems and harm social sustainability. Adding another 340 will make these problems even worse.</p>
