I strongly object to your plan to build 340 houses on land behind The Moors.

My reasons are below:

This area is open countryside which is incredibly popular with the residents of Kidlington to use for walking and most popular with dog walkers.

The area is prone to flooding with surface water lying on the fields for weeks and certainly unsuitable for building houses on.

The area is abundant with wildlife and in times of flooding have access to areas that are flood free. This would not be available to the wildlife if the area was developed.

The traffic along The Moors is already very busy.

I live along Mill Street and often have trouble getting in and out of my drive at certain times of the day. The building of 340 houses will only add to this chaos.

There are several places of accommodation for the elderly along The Moors and I am concerned for their safety. With the extra traffic this will inevitably increase these residents to risk of accident.

We already have 4,400 new homes coming to the Kidlington area.

Do we really need anymore ?

We need to save our green spaces so the people of Kidlington can enjoy the open countryside for many years and for future generations to enjoy.
