pupils from the houses let on short term arrangements at the site now have a catchment primary school of Tackley CE Primary School although not all pupils' parents choose this as their first preference so not all of the children attend this school. A previous developer provided a double temporary classroom unit as temporary additional capacity at the school for the time until the new development is started and a new school provided. The cost of travel is also met by the developer. The unit will be removed as soon as the new school is provided to return the school to a sensible size and to restore much needed play space. There are no intentions for this school to grow on a permanent basis. Tackley CE Primary School is currently a feeder school for the Marlborough School at Woodstock and thus many of its pupils attend that school. In the event of the school being oversubscribed those pupils living nearer the school will have precedence. This school is now regularly oversubscribed and there are new housing developments either under construction or planned for the near future in the town of Woodstock. This is likely to mean that pupils from Upper Heyford may not find it straightforward to gain a place in future. The new primary school will be a feeder school for secondary education in Bicester. The site will then be in the designated catchment area for Bicester.

The current capacity of Gosford Hill School is 1237, the NOR at January 2010 was 1067.
