




Map 1b Extract from S 6" sheet 1900 showing the loss of the formal layout in the Lower Park and enlargement of the grounds of Hensington House






Map 2a Extract from OS 6" sheet c1938 showing the short-lived isolation hospital off Shipton Road.



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


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







(above,top) the listed 'Cowyards' behind the WHS boundary seen from the NE. The mature tree screen on the road frontage can be seen on the right

(above) The character of the WHS Lower Park: veteran trees in a secluded setting fringed with mature trees






(Above) views towards the Site either side of 'The Cowyards' demonstrating the complete visual screen provided by the Estate boundary wall
