## Drainage

#### **Recommendation:**

### **Key issues:**

It is understood this is a reconsultation of the application on existing reference. However, Stantec have still failed to provide updated information in line with National and Local Standards. Therefore, the LLFA are unable to technically assess the proposal to ensure the scheme is deliverable.

#### **Detailed comments:**

Technical Note reference TN001 has included the OCC Pro-forma. However, the technical note does not appear to have been updated, despite numerous requests from the LLFA and LPA, to meet National and Local Standards.

The applicant requests this information is provided at Detailed Design stage. The LLFA are not happy to accept this approach as the correct standards must be applied at Outline to enable a technical assessment of the proposal to be undertaken to ensure a viable surface water drainage strategy can be delivered on the ground.

The Technical Note still refers to surface water drainage calculations using a 30% Climate Change allowance uplift. This is an outdated methodology and OCC Local Standards clearly state 40% is to be applied.

Given the information submitted a robust assessment cannot be undertaken by the LLFA.
