I understand there is some danger that if the Heyford Park development is allowed to proceed as requested, that the level crossing over the Oxford to Banbury railway line known as the Somerton Crossing, will be closed to pedestrians.

This would be a tragedy for the village of Somerton. It would close off its most popular walk used, not by the tiny number detected in the few, exceedingly wet days that numbers were surveyed, but to virtually every household in the village. We use it most days and we invariably meet several other villagers enjoying about the only 'round-the-block' walk that is available of a reasonable duration.

The reason there are not a myriad of other opportunities is that the village is cut by the Oxford Canal, the River Cherwell and the Oxford to Banbury railway line. These three barriers have very limited crossing points and effectively reduce to one, any walks of this distance, time and difficulty. If the level crossing is blocked to pedestrians this lovely walk, the only walk of its nature and one that has been used daily for centuries, will be removed.

It would mean the village of Somerton will pay a shockingly heavy price, an altogether unfair burden for the developer's gain and I urge you to fight against it, to find a solution on our behalf and on behalf of all the others from surrounding villages who have used the east-west unmetalled track that crosses at this point, since time immemorial.
