The proposed site is on a bend that is impossible to see around and will be the cause of dangerous accidents. Where would any footpath be constructed that was not truly dangerous? The road is not wide enough. Any vehicle travelling up or down the road that is met by another vehicle could very easily cause one vehicle to mount any such proposed pavement risking serious injury/death to any people using the path (particularly concerning when thinking about families and transporting small children). Why is this being considered when is so clearly dangerous and inappropriate? It is most surprising that this application has got to this point. The danger levels around this proposed project are very clear and obvious to anyone with a jot of common sense. This is a very serious matter and those making the decision should think hard about the consequences and inevitable damage, injury and worse that will be caused.
