# COUNTY COUNCIL'S RESPONSE TO CONSULTATION ON THE FOLLOWING DEVELOPMENT PROPOSAL

## **Detailed Comments**

The Lead Local Flood Authority (LLFA) object to this application as the new drainage strategy is not in line with National and Local guidance as defined in the Local Standards and Guidance for Surface Water Drainage on Major Development in Oxfordshire

The new strategy is no longer providing a sustainable drainage solution to deal with both water quantity and water quality and is no longer proposing any above ground drainage features which could have provided biodiversity benefits. The previous strategy provided these benefits with measures such as permeable paving, soakaways and infiltration basins.

The original proposal was based solely on infiltration. As this has been found to be unfeasible, the new strategy is proposing underground oversized pipes and attenuation tanks with a limited discharge into the public surface water sewer. This is not a sustainable drainage solution in line with current local and national guidance.

Tanked permeable paving and above ground attenuation where the infiltration basins were proposed previously could have been provided to manage water quality and maintain water quantity.

The LLFA cannot support the scheme until an adequate sustainable drainage scheme, in line with current local and national guidance has been provided.
