I submit my objection to the above application as follows: - Songthrush Road has been designed to Oxfordshire County highways design standards / guidance for new residential roads and its geometric layout, parking, access for residents and the local primary school users was never approved to accommodate the increased traffic loading that a new residential distributer to the new development of this application would require. Songthrush Road and Hobby Road were designed for access for the residents and users of these roads and not to allow for the increased traffic use proposed by the new development of this application! This will create an unacceptable and dangerous situation, which will be unsafe for residents of Songthrush Road and Hobby Road and the parents / children going to and from the local Longford Park Primary School. - The roads are functioning now safely at their current capacity but increased traffic loading will greatly surcharge this and in particular congest the junction with Oxford Road unacceptably and make it unsafe for the vehicles, pedestrians and cyclists using the junction in peak periods, resulting in traffic accidents, particularly with the vulnerable users, i.e. pedestrians and cyclists. - The air pollution to Songthrush Road and Hobby Road created by the vehicle flows from the new development will increase and will be unacceptable and damaging to the heath of the residents of Songthrush Road and Hobby Road who live near to the highway.
