ALL MATTERS OF DETAIL RESERVED, SAVE FOR ACCESS'

I welcome your considerations regards a proposed amendment requested by the Local Highway Authority (LHA) for the site access (from Banbury Road) and internal spine road. The LHA seeks the addition of a 3 m cycleway following the publication of LTN $1 / 20$. I here set out a brief background below.
1.1. An outline planning application, all matters reserved for subsequent approval, except for access (Planning Ref: 2019/01047/OUT) was submitted to Cherwell District Council in May 2019. The planning application was accompanied by an Environmental Statement (ES). There was a resolution to grant planning approval for the outline application at the Planning Committee held on the $15^{\text {th }}$ July 2021.
1.2. Since that time, Hallam Land Management Ltd (the Applicant) has been progressing the details of the S106 agreement. It is during this period of negotiation, that the LHA has requested that a 3 m cycle way (in addition to the 2 m footpath already included in the scheme) to be incorporated within the proposed Banbury Road Site access and internal spine road.
1.3. The site access, off Banbury Road, is detailed within the outline application. The details of the internal spine road will be subject to further Reserved Matters submissions. To facilitate the 3 m cycle path, the following plans included in the outline application, subject of the resolution to grant planning permission, have been amended. The amended plans are set down below, and attached to this letter.

- Dwg no: 10994-10-SK_018 Rev C Planning Layout
- Dwg no: 6394-P-01 rev BC - Parameters plan
1.4. The addition of the cycle path has resulted in a reduction of the number of dwellings by five due to a slightly reduced developable area. Accordingly, it is proposed the description of development is amended to:
'Outline planning application for a residential development of up to $\mathbf{8 2 0}$ dwellings; green infrastructure including formal (playing fields with changing rooms, allotments) and informal open space; landscaping and associated infrastructure including a balancing pond; on land off the A4260, with access off the existing Longford Park access off the A4260 (Oxford Road), and a new access off the A4260 (Banbury Road). All matters of detail reserved, save for access'
1.5. A review of the effects of the proposed cycle path on the findings of the ES has been undertaken and is set out in Table 1.01 below. As would be expected, the 3 m cycle path has not changed any of the significance of effects on the environmental topics included in the Environmental Impact Assessment.

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1.6. It is considered that the inclusion of the 3 m cycle path does not constitute a material change to the planning application that was debated and resolved to grant planning permission at the 15th July 2021 Planning Committee. The inclusion of the 3 m cycle path is, in fact, a positive addition to the scheme. The addition of the 3 m cycle path does not affect the S106 obligation and contributions included in the Planning Committee Report.
1.7. As the granting of planning permission has not been issued, it is requested that the plans accompanying this letter replace the submitted application plans, and form part of the outline application that benefit from a resolution to grant planning permission.
1.8. For clarity, those plans that were subject to the resolution to grant planning permission and the amended plans are set down on Table 1.02 below.
