1 Roper Road- Ash (Rear Garden)- Crown Reduction - Reducing the height and spread of the tree by a maximum of 2 meters. 1 Roper Road- Cherry (Adj Front Drive)- Crown Lift to provide 5 metres clearance from ground level (roadside only)

9 Eady Drive- Ash (Verge s/o)- Reduce & Reshape lateral spread by a maximum of 2 metres. Include clearance of BT wire by min 1m and crown thin upper canopy by 20%

17 Cheshire Drive- Ash (side of)- Fell to ground level (Signs of die-back, in close proximity to building) to include removal of 3 self set saplings below bt wire 6 portal Drive North- Cherry (rear Garden) Fell to ground level, (Poor specimen, causing excessive shading, fruit attracting stinging insects)

1 Gibson Drive- False Acacia (Rear Garden)- Crown Clean- removing dead wood and thin by 10% 2 Gibson Drive- Eucalyptus (Front Garden)- Fell to ground level 7 Portal Drive- Lime (Rear Garden)- Re-Pollard back to previous pollard points, to include crown lift of adjacent lime to 3m above ground level 10 Portal Drive North- Walnut (Rear Garden)- Crown Lift to provide 3 metres clearance from ground level (pruning secondary branches only where possible) 8 Gibson Drive- Lime (Rear Garden)Establish pollard at 4-5m

11 Gibson Drive- Willow Front Garden)- Fell to ground level 10 Portal Drive South- Lime (Rear Garden)- Re-Pollard back to previous pollard points 16 Gibson Drive- 3x False Acacia (Rear Garden)- Fell smaller of 3 trees, Crown clean larger trees- removing deadwood and 10% crown thin

3 Tate Drive- 2x Ash (Verge side of)- Prune to clear building by 2m, clear bt wire by 1m and sever ivy 15 Bader Drive- Walnut (Rear of)- Crown Lift to clear shed by 1.5m, to include removal of old poorly pruned branch stubs

21 Nettleton Drive- Lime (Rear of)- Crown Lift to provide 3 metres clearance from ground level (pruning secondary branches only) 17 Tate Drive- Ash x2 (Verge Side of)- Prune back 1x limb overhanging drive on tree clostest to road by 1.5m and prune second free to clear building by 3m to suitable growth point

9 Reid Drive- Cherry (rear garden)- Prune to clear building by 2.5m
8-7 Reid Drive- Mixed group of 4 trees (2x lime, 1x Ash, 1x Maple) on verge in front of properties- Crown Lift to provide 3 metres clearance from ground level.
(Secondary branches only) and reduce canopy of 2 end trees (building side only) by 1-2m to shape. Ensuring clearance to building of 1.5m
3-2 Reid Drive- Mixed group of 3 trees (1x Ash, 2x Maple) on verge in front of properties- Crown Lift to provide 3 metres clearance from ground level.

(Secondary branches only) and reduce canopy (building side only) by 1-2m to shape. Ensuring clearance to building of 1.5m 1 Carswell Circle- Maple (Side of)- Prune to clear building by 1.5m, to include clearance of road signs by 0.5m

22 Carswell Circle- Elder (Rear of)-Fell to ground level, close proximity to building/causing nuisance 6 Wellington Road-Birch-(Verge front of)- Fell to ground level, crown die-back with associated dead wood
